PRE-REQUISITES

Completion of year 12 in school or equivalent, or a higher qualification. A degree will be well regarded. A degree in Buddha Dhamma or in psychology will be particularly useful. These qualifications can be relaxed at the discretion of the Academic Council of the Siddhartha Institute of Buddhism.

LEVEL OF DELIVERY

The level of delivery generally corresponds to college training for a Diploma. Parts 2 to 7 will reach higher levels of delivery, right up to degree level.

CERTIFICATES AWARDED

Certificates of participation will be awarded on completion of any two parts. After satisfactory completion of all parts a Diploma Certificate in Buddhist Psychology can be awarded provided diligence is shown in following the course. Part of the diligence is to complete assignments given or in attending face to face classes..

METHOD OF DELIVERY

Learning is through reading lessons or lesson guides available on the internet and related books. Face to face classes will be afforded twice a month. Classes will be guided by two lecturers and will take the style of seminars in which everyone contributes to the discussion.

TIME TABLE AND VENUE

The time table will be settled to suit participants as much as possible. The default venue is the Sri Lanka Buddhist Monastery at 114 Considine Street, Ellen Grove, Queensland 4077. The hours will be 9.00 a.m. to 11 a.m. on the second and third Sundaya of teach month. Dates can be changed to avoid important events in the temple or another temple can be requested to assist. Class room facilities are available in the Thai temple in Forestdale..

TEACHING STAFF

Teaching staff is as appointed by the Academic Council of Siddhartha Institute of Buddhism. Qualifications expected of lecturers are on par with qualifications expected of lecturers in universities and tertiary colleges. Exceptions are made by the Academic Council. Current teachers in YSDS will be invited to teach on agreed topics.

The following have been listed to function as Lecturers and Tutors. There may be a few others nominated later on.

- 1. Venerable N. Sudhamma a nun who holds a Masters Degree in Education and other qualifications
- 2. Mr. Rahubadde Sarath-Chandra who holds several degrees and other qualifications and is the author 'Buddhist Psychology' and several other books. He also holds a Diploma in Buddhism from the Colombo YMBA.
- 3. Mr. Tanuja Y. Sarath-Chandra who holds two Masters Degrees and has completed a one year course In Buddhist Chaplaincy including practical applications of Abhidhamma

BENEFITS OF FOLLOWING THE COURSE

The course is not recognised as a qualification of any specific type of employment. However completion of the course may be well regarded in certain types of employment or engagement such as Dhamma Schools and public schools.

The value of the course is that it equips a person to guide his or her own life and to serve the community as a Teacher of Buddhism in Dhamma Schools or in state schools via BESS.

COURSE FEES AND DONATIONS
