#### SELECTION OF EDUCATION AND TRAINING PROGRAMS FOR 2018

## Course Number SIB 001:Batch Number 6 Qualifying Course for Buddhist Chaplains

The Budhist Chaplaincy training program at the qualifying level will be held for the sixth occasion beginning from Sunday 4 February 2018. The contents will be enhanced to cover some areas of mental ailments.

The intended time table is as follows:

Sunday 4 February 2018

Sunday 11 February 2018

Sunday 18 February

Sunday 11 March 2018

Each day the hours will be 9.00 a.m. to 1.00 p.m.

The campus chosen for the program is the Sri Lanka Buddhist Monastery (Brisbane), 114 Considine Street, Ellen Grove, Queensland 4078. The venue will be the second building (upstairs building) from the road.

The course leader will be Dr. Barbara Sullivan, Buddhist Chaplain. Barbara has just retired from the University of Queensland where she held the position of lecturer until recently.

Enrolments are accepted now.

The process is set out below:

- Read the 2018 Prospectus of Siddhartha Institute of Buddhism included among the documents listed at the end of the Educational Services section of the Services Menu of QSA website www.sanghaqld.org
- 2 Read the 2018 information pack on the course selected, Qualifying Course in Buddhist Chaplaincy (earlier called Part 1 of the Chaplaincy Course).
- Write an email to QSA via <u>infoqsa@gmail.com</u> stating that you wish to be enrolled as a student for this course. If you are already registered as a student for whatever course, you need to quote your student number.
- 4 In your email please give your postal address, and telephone numbers.
- 5 You will then receive confirmation of enrolment and instructions to proceed. The Registrar may ask for additional information.
- 6 If you are from another country or from a distant place in Australia and you find it difficult to attend classes, arrangements can be made to follow the course via internet. In these cases there may be further correspondence.
- 7 Please read the QSA regularly for updates of rules and processes.
- 8 Students must have completed school education. If you have higher qualifications such as Diplomas or degrees, please state so in your email. Ability to read and write, using a computer, minimum IT skills are essential.
- 9 75 % attendance or participation in required form is the minimum expected.
- 10 A take home examination will be given at the end of the ourse in addition to ongoing assessments and reading.

Course Number SIB 003: Teaching Meditation for Buddhist Chaplains
Meditation for Buddhist Chaplains

- 1 The enrolment process is similar to that given under Course SIB 001 above with obvious relaxations for students already registered with the Siddhartha Institute of Buddhism.
- 2 The course is primarily intended for those who have already qualified as Buddhist Chaplains. However others may enroll for the course giving a reason why they wish to follow this course.
- 3 The course dates are:

June 2018

Sunday 3rd Sunday 10 th Sunday 17th

- 4 Course hours are 9.00 a.m. to 1.00 p.m.
- 5 The venue Will be the Ellen Grove Campus, Sri Lanka Buddhist Monastery (Brisbane), 114 Considine Street, Ellen Grove, Queensland 4078.

- 6 The Meditation Hall or the Library room in the new buildings at the front will be venue.
- 7 80% attendance is expected.
- 8 A take home examination will be given at the end of the course in addition to ongoing reading and assessments.
- 9 The course leader will be Dr. Barbara Sullivan, formerly of the academic staff of the University of Queensland. Barbara is a Buddhist Chaplain registered with QSA.
- 10 You can ask for the information pack by sending an email to QSA
