MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE MEETING NUMBER 50

QSA is in its 15th year. The 50th meeting of the committee of management was held on 25 June 2022.

The committee consists of four monks and three lay persons. It is supported by about fifteen executives responsible for various functions. The much larger groups of advisors, consultants and lecturers need to be remembered for their silent contribution.

The senate of the Siddhartha Institute of Buddhism, the Buddhist Chaplaincy Services Board, and the Buddhist Publications Advisory Board need special mention.

A Federal Government grant for \$ 3230 has been received for the purchase of a computer and printer for QSA. We appreciate the interest taken by Milton Dick, Federal MP for Oxley. Computer equipment was purchased for QSA using the grant. A special mention must go to Mr. Krishan Jayalath for his time and effort in researching the most suitable equipment to be purchased and for organising the purchase and dleivry of the equipment.

QUEENSLAND BUDDHIST CONVOCATION 06 HELD SATURDAY 25 JUNE 2022

The 6th Queensland Buddhist convocation was held at the Thai Temple Wat Thai Buddharam, 1 Paradise Road, Forestdale, Queensland 4118, commencing at 9.00 am on Saturday 25 June 2022.

Certificates of honour were awarded to about fifty individuals in recognition of services they are engaged in for the advancement of Buddhism in Queensland. Some had rendered voluntary services to the Queensland Sangha Association Inc or to the Buddhist Education Services for Schools Inc.

There were individuals, including monks, who had played a lead role in Buddhist education in the Siddhartha Institute of Buddhism, the education division of QSA. Some had functioned as volunteer Religious Instruction teachers of Buddhism in state schools in Queensland.

Another group had participated in the training program for Buddhist Counsellors.

The convocation formalities over, the group had time for a get together. Volunteers led by Surangika Sarath-Chandra provided refreshments for all present.

The convocation was organised by Serene Loy, Events Manager of QSA.

The monks and nuns gave blessings to all. The vote of thanks was given by Serene Loy, the event manager.



POSTHUMOUS AWARD TO BENEFACTOR MRS. VINITHA SARATH-CHANDRA

A posthumous award was conferred at the 6th Queensland Buddhist Convocation, to the late Mrs. Vinitha Sarath-Chandra who passed away at 83 years of age on 23 January 2022. To the Queensland Sangha Association Inc (QSA), Vinitha was a benefactor from inception until she finally fell ill.

Vinitha Sarath-Chandra (nee Weerasinghe) Born on 18 July 1938 Passed away on 23 January 2022

Vinitha was a trained secondary school science teacher in Sri Lanka (1961-1978). She was trained at the Maharagama Science training College.

She was Assistant Secretary of the All-Ceylon Buddhist Students Federation (BSF) in Sri Lanka (1962), the then largest youth organisation in Southeast Asia with about 2500 member societies in schools and other educational institutions throughout the island of Sri Lanka.

After migration to Australia in 1978, Vinitha was a businessperson, operating a school wear business in Highgate Hill, Brisbane, Queensland, Australia (1981-2007). The business serviced the needs of the largest public high school in Queensland, Brisbane State High School. The shop premises became the base from which two large temples and two valuable Buddhist organisations, namely the Buddhist Education Services for Schools Inc. (BESS) and QSA emanated.

Vinitha was the benefactor of the first Dhamma School in Australia, Highgate Hill, Brisbane, Queensland, Australia (1982). The school commenced with about 10 students and two teachers. It was conducted in a part of her business premises. This Dhamma school is continuing to date at the Thai temple Wat Thai Buddharam, Forestdale, Queensland, Australia and in the Sri Lanka Buddhist Monastery (Brisbane), Ellen Grove, Queensland, Australia as two separate entities.

Vinitha was the former president of the Buddhist Meditation and Study Association Inc, Highgate Hill, Brisbane, Australia (1986-1987). The beginning of the Thai Temple was in one of the units annexed to Vinitha's shop. For a few months, two monks of the Thai Maha Nikaya conducted religious services from this unit. The monks' requisites were looked after by Vinitha. When larger premises were found, the monks moved to a rented premises in Graceville, Brisbane. The organisation was re-named as the Thai Temple from 1988. Now this temple is in Forestdale, Logan City on a large block of land located at 1 Paradise Road, Forestdale, Queensland 4118.

Vinitha was later president of the Sri Lanka Buddhist Monastery (Brisbane), Ellen Grove, Brisbane, Australia (1995). She played the lead role and made incredible personal and financial sacrifices in the acquisition of the present premises comprising one hectare of land.

She played a lead role in both temples, participating in numerous fund raising and cultural activities to help establish and maintain the temples over many years.

Later she functioned as the promoter and benefactor of the Buddhist Education Services for Schools Inc, (BESS) of Queensland, Australia, (2005-2006) hosting meetings in her shop and promoting the teaching of Buddhism in public schools.

Vinitha was co-promoter and benefactor of the Queensland Sangha Association Inc, Australia, (2006-2018). QSA provides numerous services to the Sangha and to Buddhism.

Vinitha leaves behind her son Tanuja Yasanga Sarath-Chandra and her husband Rahubadde Sarath-Chandra.

With the power of these meritorious deeds, may Vinitha attain the supreme bliss of Nibbana!
